Resolution

Resolution Establishing Civil Fees and

Criminal and Traffic Assessments

to be charged by the Clay County Clerk of the Circuit Court

WHEREAS, a Resolution passed August 12, 2003 by the County Board, currently set forth the fees authorized by the County Board to be charged in both civil and criminal cases in Clay County; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly passed comprehensive legislation in 2018, which completely overhauls the criminal, traffic and civil fee structures in the circuit courts throughout the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the legislation was to consolidate fees into unified schedules for all counties, to realign fees to be constitutional, and to provide for fee waivers for low income individuals; and

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2019, Section 27.1b of the Clerks of the Courts Act, 705 ILCS 105/27.1b, sets out the fees to be charged in all counties in the State of Illinois by the Clerks of the Circuit Court for the filing of pleadings and for other services provided by the Clerks in civil cases; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.1b of the Clerks of the Courts Act creates four schedules for civil filing fees, three schedules for civil appearance fees, and establishes various other fees that Clerks of the Circuit Court are authorized to assess in civil cases, all of which are generally classified as "not to exceed" amounts; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.1b provides that, unless otherwise specified, the amount of the fees shall be determined by ordinance or resolution of the county board and remitted to the county treasurer to be used for purposes related to the operation of the COURT SYSTEM in the county; and

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2019, the newly-adopted Criminal and Traffic Assessment Act, 705 ILCS 105/135 et seq., sets out minimum fines to be levied

and assessments to be charged in criminal and traffic cases by the Clerks of the Circuit Court in all counties in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Sections 15-5 through 15-65 of the Criminal and Traffic Assessment Act establish thirteen (13) assessment schedules for various criminal, traffic, conservation and non-traffic offenses, and for each schedule the County's portion of the assessment is specifically listed; and

Civil Fees and Criminal Assessments

Civil fees and Criminal assessments shall meet the requirements of Section 27.1b of the Clerks of the Courts Act, 705 ILCS 105/27.1b, and the Criminal and Traffic Assessment Act, 705 ILCS 105/135 et seq.

Civil Fees

- A. Fees in civil matters shall be assessed and distributed as set forth herein, in compliance with Section 27.1b of the Clerks of the Courts Act, 705 ILCS 105/27.1b.

19. Unpaid Fees.

Unless a court ordered payment schedule is implemented or the fee requirements of this Section are waived by court order, the Clerk is authorized to add to any unpaid fees and costs a delinquency amount equal to 15% of the unpaid fees that remain unpaid after 90 days.

Delinquency amounts collected pursuant to this provision shall be deposited into the Circuit Court Clerk Operation and Administrative Fund to defray additional administrative costs incurred by the Clerk in collecting unpaid fees and costs.

Establishment of Clay County Crime Stoppers Fund

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Clay County Crime Stoppers is to combat crime; to obtain and disseminate information relating to crime and crime related problems in an effort to develop a safer community with less crime; to provide education to the general public on specific crime problems; to offer rewards for information that leads to an arrest; to cooperate with law enforcement agencies in matters relating to law enforcement and also the prevention of crime and to accept contributions;

WHEREAS, The Clay County Board may adopt a fee of Fifteen (\$15.00) to be paid to the Clay County Crime Stoppers by the Defendant on a judgment of guilty or a grant of court supervision under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections for any felony, and, for a Class A, Class B, or Class C misdemeanor Offense, but shall not be assessed upon any juvenile case; and,

WHEREAS, such assessments are to be collected by the Clerk of the Circuit Court and may be deposited into an account specifically for the operation and administration of the Clay County Crime Stoppers. The Clerk of the Circuit Court shall remit such fees to the Clay County Crime Stoppers at the end of each month.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the County Board of Clay County, Illinois that the Clay County Circuit Clerk shall establish a Clay County Crime Stoppers fund, and shall collect a fee of Fifteen (\$15.00) upon judgment of guilty or a grant of court supervision being entered upon a felony, and for a Class A, Class B, or Class C Misdemeanor Offense, but shall not be assessed upon any juvenile case.
