ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2020-5

WHEREAS, the Circuit Judges of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Court have appointed Christopher S. Elliott as Public Defender of Clay County, for the period from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge has administrative authority to establish the terms and conditions under which the Public Defender shall perform his duties of office.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, that the terms and conditions under which the Public Defender in Clay County shall perform his duties of office are as follows:

I. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

A) The Public Defender shall represent those individuals who are designated by the Court to receive the service of the Public Defender's Office of Clay County pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/3-4006. The Public Defender shall be available to represent said individuals at all times that court is in session in Clay County. Should a conflict of interest in representation of a defendant arise, the Public Defender's Office shall petition the court to withdraw from said representation.

B) The Public Defender is employed in a full-time capacity and shall not engage in private practice. The Public Defender shall comply with normal office hours which the courthouse is open and as followed by other county employees. It is understood that the Public Defender must investigate cases, perform legal research, visit incarcerated prisoners, meet with clients, attorneys, police officers, and other witnesses and involved parties, perform administrative and clerical duties, prepare all documents necessary for the proper operation of the position, appear and participate in admitting appointed clients into the Problem Solving Court and make appearances with appointed

Clay County clients at the Effingham County Courthouse when deemed necessary by the court, and perform any other responsibilities of the position that may require work outside the court and, at times, beyond normal office hours. It is understood that the Public Defender will be available at all times as required by the court in the exercise of duties.

C) Additionally, so long as the position remains full-time, the Public Defender shall represent those defendants remanded to the Illinois Department of Corrections on their post-conviction petitions pursuant to 725 ILCS 5/122-1 when appointed by the court.

D) Additionally, so long as the position remains full-time, the Public Defender shall represent those persons named in petitions filed pursuant to the Sexually Violent Persons Commitment Act (725 ILCS 207/1 et seq.) and the Sexually Dangerous Persons Act (725 ILCS 205/0.01 et seq.).

E) Additionally, so long as the position remains full-time, the Public Defender shall represent indigent persons who pursue appeals to the Appellate Court or Supreme Court on juvenile cases.

F) Additionally, so long as the position remains full-time, the Public Defender shall represent indigent litigants as guardian ad litem in civil proceedings, including, but not limited to, minors and alleged disabled adults, when appointed by the court.

G) Additionally, the court may appoint the Public Defender to represent non-indigent litigants as guardian ad litem in civil proceedings, including, but not limited to, minors and alleged disabled adults, when appointed by the court, but the Public Defender may receive additional compensation for these duties assessed by the court commiserate to the services performed to be paid by sources other than the County of Clay.

H) The Public Defender shall be qualified and remain qualified to be appointed in child custody and visitation matters covered under Section IX of the Supreme Court Rules as guardian ad litem, child representatives, or attorneys for children, pursuant to Fourth Judicial Circuit Amended Administrative Order No. 2006-8.

II. TERM AND TERMINATION

A) The term of this Order shall be from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2022. It is further provided that this Order shall be subject to termination upon cancellation of the appointment by a majority of the Circuit Judges of the Fourth Judicial Circuit with or without cause. Upon termination or cancellation, all rights and duties of the Public Defender and of Clay County under this Order shall cease to exist. The Public Defender shall have the right to terminate his or her appointment upon 60 days notice to both the Chief Judge and the Chairman of the County Board.

B) The Public Defender must apply for reappointment by written notification to the Chief Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit and to the Circuit Judge residing in Clay County at least 90 days prior to the termination of this Order. In the event the Public Defender is reappointed, such renewal shall be for a period of two years.

III. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES

A) For the purpose of compensation, the Public Defender of Clay County shall be considered to be a full-time employee of Clay County at a salary equal to 90% of the current salary of the Clay County State's Attorney on the first day of this appointment as set forth in 55 ILCS 5/3-4007. The salary shall be payable in intervals as determined by Clay County. This salary shall be modified hereafter as is consistent with any modifications in the annual salary of the State's Attorney. This salary is further contingent upon the State of Illinois reimbursing Clay County 66 2/3% of this annual Public Defender's salary as also required in said statute. In the event the State does not pay that amount, and becomes delinquent in reimbursement payments to Clay County by more than six (6) consecutive months, then the position of Public Defender may become part-time with a minimum requirement of 30 hours of work per week at the request of Clay County, with a salary of \$75,000.00 per year with all the fringe benefits remaining, including but not limited to, Clay County's contribution to the Public Defender's IMRF and the employee's individual health insurance. In this event the Public Defender would not absolutely be prohibited from private law practice in a private capacity, so long as such practice does not interfere in any way with the duties as Public Defender. That additionally, if Clay County, upon lack of reimbursement by the State for six (6) consecutive months, elects to reduce the salary of the Public Defender to \$75,000.00, then the Public Defender's office shall still be available for use by the Public Defender in his duties as Public Defender.

B) In the event the Public Defender deems it necessary to employ the services of a private investigator, licensed physician, psychologist, psychiatrist, or other expert witness during the course of representation of persons pursuant to the Order, the Public Defender must first apply to the Circuit Court for approval of such employment by written motion in said case with a copy to the State and can employ such persons only after judicial approval is obtained. After such approval is obtained, the Public Defender shall not be liable for payment of such services or expenses related directly thereto, but payment, pursuant to submission of a proper bill, voucher and Order of the Circuit Court shall be made by Clay County.

C) Clerical and office expense incurred shall be in accordance with the budget appropriation by the Clay County Board. The Public Defender shall submit and manage the budget for the Public Defender's Office.

IV. OUTSIDE SERVICES

A) This Order and payment hereunder does not encompass appointments by the Court for representation of defendants remanded to the Illinois Department of Corrections or to a similar correctional institution for the purpose of proceedings of the following nature.

- i. Pursuit of appeals beyond the perfecting of appeal by preparation and filing of Notice of Appeal, Docketing Statement, and related Notices in cases where the State Appellate Defender prosecutes the appeal.
- ii. Pursuit of any federal remedy of a post-conviction or civil rights nature.



RE: West Side/Central TIF Extension

Dear Ted:

The City of Flora is exploring the idea of extending the life of the West Side/Central TIF area to create more time for existing as well as new projects. The original TIF area was created in 1997 and was instrumental in several redevelopment, infrastructure and taxing body projects including the school district.

TIF stands for Tax Increment Financing and is a useful tool to pay for infrastructure improvements and provide financial incentives for economic development projects as can be seen in the Flora West Side/Central TIF District.

When the original TIF was established a "base" value for all real estate in the TIF area is established and any increases after the establishment go into a special TIF fund for use on public or private development projects. The base value for this TIF will not change, unless new properties are added to the TIF area. New properties have their own base value, but the original TIF area's base will not change.

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Projects may include renovating existing properties, paying for legal professional services, paying for infrastructure improvements and all associated development costs for the private or public developer.

The goal of TIF district is to attract private investment in the specific area to benefit the community by providing jobs and improving blighted areas, but also to increase the tax revenue for all taxing bodies.

The typical life a TIF district is twenty-three (23) years, but the Illinois legislature allows communities to extend the life of their TIF district for twelve (12) years. The legislature will only allow communities to extend their support from one hundred percent (100%) of the overlapping taxing bodies involved. Once one hundred percent (100%) support is demonstrated by providing letters of support to the City, a bill is introduced in the General Assembly (either through the Senate or House) and submitted for vote. Once the bill is signed into law, the life of the local TIF district will be extended for twelve (12) years with a new total life of thirty-five (35) years.

If everything goes smoothly, the TIF area will expire in 2032. This additional time will allow for more projects to occur and more benefits to be realized by all taxing bodies as well as to continue with existing development projects.

Therefore, the City of Flora is asking for the support of the taxing bodies for the TIF extension. I have enclosed herewith a form letter which may be used and will be submitted to the Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity as well as the legislature.
